Literacy


We will prioritise learning the fundamentals of literacy - fluency in speaking, reading and writing. In the early years and key stage 1 we will teach a structured phonics programme to ensure that no child is left behind.



Read Write Inc. is a government recommended phonics programme that has been proven to raise achievement in children's reading ability. Our staff will be trained to deliver high quality phonics and literacy lessons that children will enjoy and benefit from. Alongside RWI, we will ensure that students develop a love of reading by exposing them to a variety of story books as well as non-fiction texts to really fire their imagination.




For older students we will be teaching text based literacy through the use of high quality texts, both fiction and non-fiction. This will allow students to immerse themselves in a text in depth. Teachers will ensure that all of the key areas of learning are covered by following a comprehensive teaching cycle which children will enjoy.



The texts students cover will be diverse and reflect the community we live in, celebrating talented people from all backgrounds. They will learn about interesting themes and challenging topics that will develop their understanding of the world.

Maths

Mathematics will be taught using a mastery approach as we believe that this is the most effective way of ensuring that all students develop a deep and long-lasting understanding of the subject. This will involve:

- The aim that all/most pupils can and will achieve
- Keeping the class working together so that all can master mathematics
- Development of deep mathematical knowledge
- Development of both factual/procedural and conceptual fluency
- Longer time on key topics

Students will be given the opportunity to problem solve, reason and develop a strong conceptual understanding in their maths lessons. We will place a high importance on students understanding the real world application of maths, including its use in science, engineering and design. Students will also study famous mathematicians and their work, such as:




Fibonnaci and his famous Fibonacci sequence 1, 1, 2, 3, 5, 8 ...

Enrichment

Students will extend their learning and development beyond the classroom, through unique opportunities that stretch their understanding of the world. For example, when they study Mary Anning in science lessons at key stage 2 they will visit Lyme Regis and experience fossil hunting for themselves. Or when they study mountain topography in geography lessons they will be given the opportunity to climb an actual mountain.













All students will be given the exciting opportunity to learn a new language. Music lessons will extend into after school clubs, with Concordia producing its own school choir and a school band. Life skills like cooking and planting will be taught as part of our commitment to developing fully rounded individuals through memorable real life experiences.

We will be offering Breakfast Club as soon as we are in our new building, as well as a variety of after school clubs including:

- Debate Club
- Chess Club
- Art Club
- Dance Club
- Football Club (for boys and girls)
- Film Club

Our links with the local community will involve visits to West Ham's training ground in Romford where students will hopefully take part in training sessions. Queen's Theatre in Hornchurch will allow our students to see local productions, and put on their own show!
