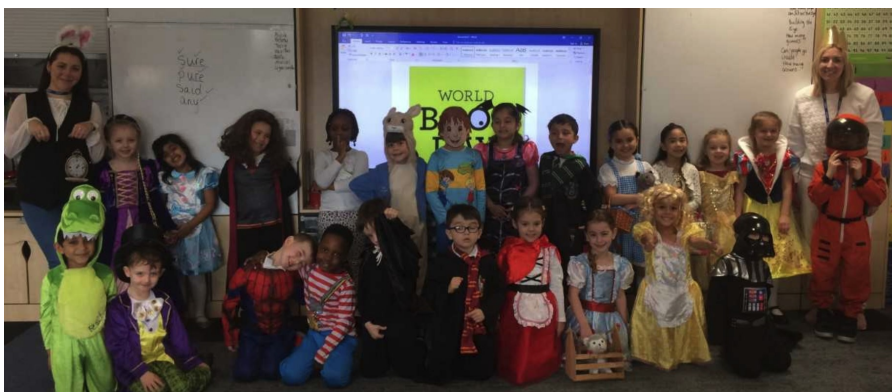


Friday 8 March 2019

DESIGN PROJECT WINNERS

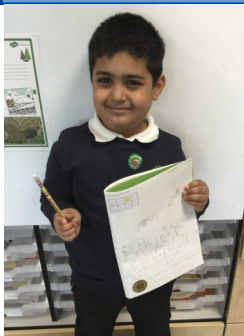
