



Diwali

In Year 1 we have been learning about Diwali. We learned that this is known as the festival of lights and is celebrated in October or November. We learned about many stories and traditions that are celebrated at Diwali. It is an exciting festival of food, fun, family and light. As part of our learning we made our own diva lamps using salt dough, then we painted them bright colours.

The children have also been learning about the story of Rama and Sita. The children used the diva lamps they made to guide the main characters home. The theme of good overcoming evil inspired the children to share real-

life examples of good and evil and explore the idea further in stories from different religions.
