CURRICULUM CORNER—YEAR 5

In Year 5, we have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians in our Topic lessons. We learnt about canopic jars and the importance of pots and jars in Ancient Egypt. First, we designed our jars and pots using inspiration from Ancient Egypt, then we used clay to mould them and a pencil tip to add detail. Finally, we had lots of fun painting our amazing creations!





Did you know that the Ancient Egyptians were one of the first civilisations to use pots and jars? They were primarily used to hold food items and water from the River Nile. However, canopic jars were different, they held the major organs belonging to Pharaohs!
