#### 11before11

REAch2 and Concordia Academy have a stated aim of giving children in all of our schools a minimum of 11 unique experiences before they leave primary school. These experiences are what we call 11before11.

At Concordia, we aim to give our children experiences that they may never have outside of school. Since we opened in 2016, Concordia children have, amongst other things, experienced some 11before11 events. They have sung carols for the elderly at local care homes, visited Queens Theatre to watch Beauty and the Beast, raised money for several different charities, worked with a specialist Fine Artist to create high quality finished artworks, and taken part in cookery workshops with a specialist chef. Unfortunately, and due to restrictions imposed as a result of Covid-19, the last two years have not allowed us to deliver further experiences for our children. However, now that life in society is beginning to return to normality, we are keen to deliver an 11before11 experience for each year group this year. The experiences will include, a flashmob performance (choreographed by a professional dancer) at a local public shopping centre, watching a live performance at the West End, and a charity project focusing on an area of need in the local community. As you can see from the Key Dates section, Reception and Y1 have their 11before11 event next week when we have an external company coming in all day to deliver a Bug Workshop!

We have an 11before11 page on our website which will, over time, contain images of some of the wonderful experiences our children have taken part in. In the meantime, please do speak to your child's class teacher if you have any questions.












During the assembly, the competition winners were announced – there were a large number of entries across the whole school and everyone who entered produced incredible work! Here are a few examples of the work from the competition:
