
#### **HEADTEACHER AWARD**



### **CURRICULUM CORNER—YEAR 4**

This week, Year 4 had a carousel of activities on World Maths Day. The children were exploring a range of maths skills that are used every day. They were also able to record data using a tally chart and present this as a bar chart. Some children even tried to represent this data as a pie chart! Year 4 explored the use of money and how to give change.
