
### **CURRICULUM CORNER- RECEPTION**

In Reception this half term, we are learning about Space! This week, we were reading the story 'Aliens love Underpants.' Children acted out the story with puppets and talked about their favourite alien from the book. We looked at different adjectives that could be used to describe the aliens and their underpants, and we used our phonic sounds to write these adjectives down. Children especially enjoyed making a spaceship for the aliens in the construction area. Additionally, reception made their own necklaces with a repeating pattern for Diwali. We have also been making poppies using tissue paper and pipe cleaners for Remembrance Day.
