

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# **CURRICULUM CORNER- YEAR 1**

This week in Year 1, we have been learning addition using the part- part whole method.

Complete the table to match the birds.

We have been learning about materials this week and have been trying to describe their properties – which materials are hard, soft, bendy, flexible or rigid.

This term in Design and Technology, we are making windmills. Over the next few weeks, the children will be looking at the main features of a windmill – structure, <u>axel</u> and turbine. This week they made the main structure. They used their fine motor skills to cut and stick paper and card.



During Music, we have been learning to sing the song, 'The animals went in two by two...'


#### **MAGNOLIA CLASS TRIP**
